Sports Coach

i As a Sport Coach your job can depend on the sport and who you are coaching! You can coach in education, competitive sport, national and international. This sector is predicted to grow by **6.2%** creating an extra **52,227** jobs by 2027 in the UK.

£ £14,000 - £35,000 per year

✓ Working 36 – 38 hours per week

You'll usually need either a foundation degree, coaching qualification recognised by the National governing body, degree in sports and exercise science or apprenticeship. Entry requirements 2 or 3 A Levels, or equivalent for a degree, 4 or 5 GCSEs at grades 9 to 4.

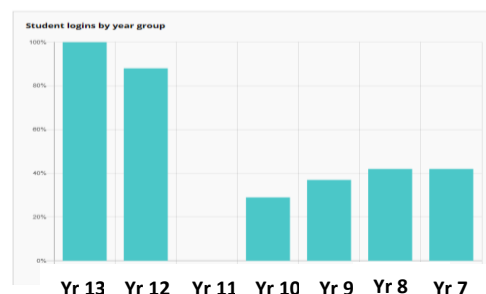
