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St. Thomas More High School Aims

As a Catholic school, St Thomas More High School we aim to provide a curriculum which inspires and challenges all our pupils, and enables them to become:

- **★ successful learners** who enjoy learning, are well informed, make progress and achieve;
- ★ **confident young adults** who are able to live safe, healthy and fulfilling lives founded on their Catholic Christian faith;
- ★ **responsible citizens** who make a socially and economically positive contribution to wider British society.

The school's curriculum plan relates directly to our key school aims. We aim to develop the school's community to provide a disciplined, caring and stable environment in which pupils can achieve their best and develop as confident young people, well prepared and fully equipped to make a positive contribution to the wider world as responsible citizens.

As a Catholic school we respect each pupil as a unique person with God given gifts, qualities and particular needs.

ST THOMAS MORE HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULUM IMPLEMENTATION

Organisation of the School Day

St. Thomas More operates a two week timetable of:

- ✓ 10 x 25min registration/form/assembly time
- ✓ 50 hours of curriculum teaching periods. 5 hours per day including some 'double' two hour lessons for years 10-13.
- ✓ School day 8.45am 3.30pm
- ✓ Total school hours per week = 33hr45mins

The curriculum is organised and delivered in such a way as to provide value for money, ensuring sensible and economic use of the financial resources of the school.
