Dear parent or carer

Firstly, I want to thank you for your continued support and cooperation with school attendance and testing. I know that it has been challenging school year what with home learning, face coverings, altered school collections and testing, on top of all the other social restrictions this pandemic has brought. However, I hope you know how vitally important it has been and continues to be, for the protection of our students, our teaching staff, your family and the wider community.

As I am sure you have seen in the press and on social media, there has been an increase in the number of positive Covid results for the Delta variant in the north of England, as well as increases in Essex and Southend over the past few weeks. Whilst overall infection rates remain low across the Borough currently, since the May/June half term there has been a rise in the number of infections within our schools and it does seem to be the younger generations who are becoming infected with this variant.

So, I want to urge you to continue testing and encourage your teenagers and young people to do the same. Please make sure your children:

- Test twice weekly
- Ideally test the night before a school day
- Wait the full 30 minutes before checking the result
- Record the result on the NHS website
- If a test is positive follow-up with a PCR test, for confirmation and to help scientists identify which variant.

If you are worried about carrying out a self-test, there is assisted testing in eight pharmacies across the Borough where you can be helped to do your test.

If your test is positive and your household needs to isolate, there is still funding support in place for those who qualify.
