Early Closure on St Thomas More Day 26th June – parents should have received a letter via email informing them of the arrangements for St Thomas More Day which is celebrated on Friday 26th June. Our Feast Day Mass will take place in the morning, followed by house mini-sports (PE kits will be needed if your child is taking part in the mini-sports). **The celebrations will finish at approximately 1:20pm, after this time, students will be dismissed for an early finish.** To date, the school contract buses have informed us that they will be collecting the pupils at their usual departure time so we encourage you to make alternative arrangements for your child to travel home as the school site will be closing at 1:30pm. If you are unable to make alternative travel arrangements, then you **must** let us know by calling the school on 01702 344933 or by emailing: office@st-thomasmore.southend.sch.uk giving your child's full name and form. If we do not hear from you, your son will leave at 1:30pm along with the rest of the school. We hope for very warm and sunny weather, in which case could you please ensure your child has a hat, sun cream and a water bottle to replenish during the day. Our students, as always, are ambassadors for the school and we therefore expect the highest standards of behaviour. Should, however, behaviour in school at any time on this day give us cause for concern, we reserve the right to withdraw them from activities.

Summer Uniform and Shirt Sleeve Order: A reminder that throughout the summer students are still required to wear their blazer to school unless we experience very hot weather. If hot weather is forecast, then we will contact parents to let them know if students are not required to wear a blazer to school. If this is the case and students choose not to wear their blazer, this should not be replaced by a coat, jacket or hoodie.

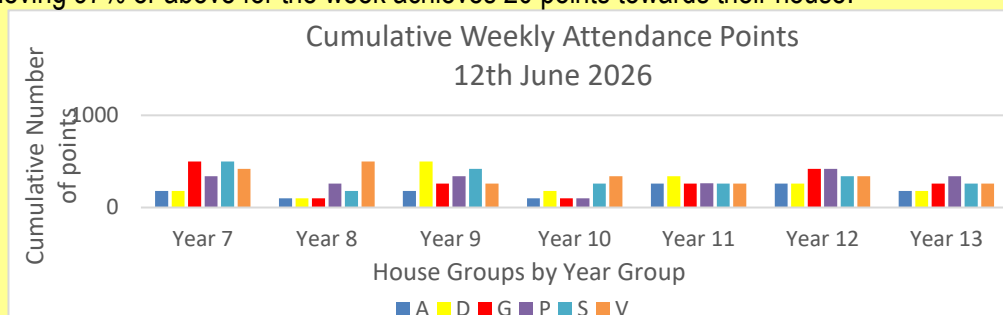

Absence: If your child is unwell and unable to attend, please notify the school of the reason for the absence on the first day of an unplanned absence by 9am or as soon as practically possible by calling the school and selecting attendance or by emailing attendance@st-thomasmore.southend.sch.uk. If the absence lasts more than one day, please update the school daily. Attending a medical or dental appointment will be counted as authorised if the pupil's parent/carer notifies the school in advance of the appointment. We encourage parents/carers to make medical and dental appointments out of school hours where possible. Where this is not possible, the pupil should be out of school for the minimum amount of time necessary. You can request a leave of absence for exceptional circumstances by through school gateway or alternatively email attendance@st-thomasmore.southend.sch.uk or by collecting a form from Reception. Please keep medical evidence of absence e.g. appointment cards or letters, copies of prescriptions, pharmacy receipts etc in case you need them to provide more details on your child's return to school.

House Attendance Points: The form with the highest attendance in the year group gets 100 points each week and every form achieving 97% or above for the week achieves 20 points towards their house.



Student Medical Conditions: Please ensure school is made aware of any updates regarding students medical conditions, particularly if they can potentially have an impact on their time in school and require support. Please contact Mrs Walford mwalford@st-thomasmore.southend.sch.uk if you wish to discuss your case in detail.

Changes to Contact Details: If you have moved house, changed your email address, mobile telephone number or work contact number, etc. **please remember you can make these changes via your child's [MCAS](#) account.**

Parking Reminder: Despite persistent reminders, parents are still parking dangerously by the red gate exit at the end of each day. This is extremely dangerous as students, particularly those on cycles must swerve to get around illegally parked vehicles. We have contacted the Local Authority, and if it continues, we have been asked to record number plates of offending vehicles to pass on to the traffic department. Could you please co-operate for the safety of our students.

16–19 Bursary Fund – Support for Sixth Form Students

The Government's **16–19 Bursary Fund** is available to help students stay in education by covering costs such as travel, meals, books, equipment, and trips. There are two types of bursaries:

- **Vulnerable Student Bursary** – up to £1,200 for young people in care, care leavers, or those receiving certain benefits.
- **Discretionary Bursary** – for students facing financial hardship, awarded by the school based on household income and individual need.

To apply, parents/students should complete the bursary application form (available from the Sixth Form office or school website) and provide supporting evidence. 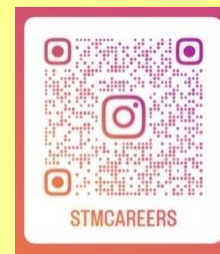

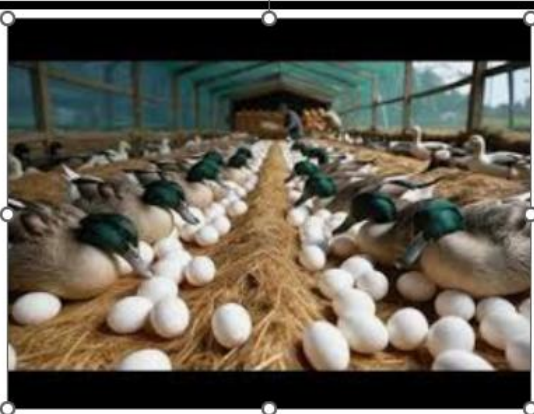

Sports News



PE Students of the Week: It's a 'Double David' week this week! Both boys have impressed immensely in Athletics. David from Year 7 put in some great performances on the track in both Nationals and Sports Day this week. Meanwhile, David from Year 8 was the star performer at the National competition, scoring a combined 45 points from his two events. Well done to both boys.



Track & Field Cup - Regional A Final - National Athletics: After the success of our Junior team making our first Regional A final, BOTH the Junior (Yr7&8) and Inters (9&10) made this prestigious stage of the competition. Having seen off over 70 schools that enter Round 1 (R1) we made it to the best 12 schools in the East Anglian region. Excellent individual performances from the INTERS team included more PB's for Lewis 2.08 & Corban 2.15 in the 800m, Lewis also cleared 1m62 in HJ, Shay 4.57 in the 1500m, Harry & Diego 38secs in the 300m Sop & Sean both went over 11m in Shot Putt. For the JUNIORS David O, threw 31m in Discus and ran 42secs for the 300m, Matt A ran 25 secs in 200m and cleared 1m50 for HJ.



Jnr NBA: The Junior NBA team produced a fantastic display on Finals Day, showing resilience, teamwork and determination to be crowned champions. In the semi-final, we faced The Latymer School. The game started closely, with both teams trading baskets in an evenly contested opening period. However, some excellent defensive adjustments allowed us to take control of the game. Increased intensity and disciplined team defence disrupted Latymer's rhythm, enabling us to pull away and secure a comfortable victory to book our place in the final. The championship game saw us take on Wymondham High School, and it proved to be a much tougher challenge. A nervous start saw us fall behind early, trailing 13–8 at the end of the first quarter. Despite the slow start, the boys remained composed and focused on the task ahead. Changes in defensive personnel helped turn the tide, with the team applying greater pressure and limiting Wymondham's scoring opportunities. At the offensive end, Derick delivered an outstanding performance, scoring an incredible 42 points to inspire the comeback and help us take control of the contest. It was far from a one-man effort, though. Max orchestrated play brilliantly, moving the ball selflessly and creating opportunities for his teammates with some excellent passing. Defensively, David and Billy were exceptional, providing energy, commitment and determination to shut down key opposition players, and counter at speed. The Finals Day success was a reflection of the hard work, dedication and team spirit shown by the entire squad throughout the season.



Sports Day – Track Events: Years 7, 8, 9, 10 and 12 took part in Sports Day this week, participating in a number of track events including 100m, 200m, 300m, 800m and 4 x 100m Relay. Unfortunately, the weather meant we were without spectators this year, yet all competitors still gave their best efforts to represent their houses. In the Junior Competition, Patricks came out on top, with Georges and Davids finishing second and third, respectively. In the Senior Competition, Andrews were victorious, with Davids and Georges making up the rest of the podium positions. Our attention now moves to next week's Borough Athletics Competition. Well done to all boys involved.
