

Departmental News

Instrumental Lessons

Spaces are now available for next term if students wish to receive instrumental or vocal lessons

Lessons currently offered at the school by our visiting team of experienced and professional tutors are:

- Piano
- Keyboard
- Guitar Classical / Electric / Bass
- Drums
- Strings Violin / Cello
- Woodwind Flute / Clarinet / Saxophone
- Singing

Lessons currently cost £75 per term this is for a series of 10, 15 minute lessons. Or with the agreement of the tutor and another student a shared lesson of 30mins.

Students would leave their normal curriculum lesson in order to go to their instrumental / vocal lesson. They would then return back to their curriculum lesson once their instrumental lesson has finished.

Wherever possible instrumental lessons are run on a carousel basis so that students will not always miss the same lesson or part of lesson.

Although prices are set down by Southend Music Hub as a school we offer free lessons for any students who would be eligible for free school meals.

There is also a further reduction of 50% for students with a form of special educational need.

In some cases the initial hire or loan of an instrument can be arranged for the first term.

Students already having instrumental lessons - Payment for next terms lessons is due by 12th December on Parent Pay. If it is not done by this date students will not be accepted for lessons next term. For further details speak to Mr Riches.
