Dear Parents and Pupils,

Year 11 Parent and Student Study Skills and Information Evening 14th October at 6pm - The Study Skills evening is designed to answer many of the questions that you and your son will have regarding your son's preparation for his forthcoming examinations in May and June, as well as the mocks in November. It is often the case that parents are unaware of the amount of work and effort that we expect our students to put in to succeed in these very important examinations. We also hear from parents that they do not know how to help or support their sons during this busy and often stressful time. For the students this will also be a valuable opportunity for them to pick up advice and guidance on how to prepare for this intensive period of examinations. Non-Uniform Day- On Friday 9th October we will be having a wear it bright non-uniform

day in aid of CAFOD Harvest Fast Day. The arrangements and rules for this fundraising day are given below. Pupils are allowed to come to school in their ordinary clothes, (the brighter, the better!) rather than school uniform, provided they pay at least £1 into the charity fund here at school. The money should be paid via School Gateway by 8th

October, or alternatively, can be given to your son's/daughter's form teacher. We do have very strict rules and expectations about what pupils may wear on non-uniform days and these are summarised here for you:-

Smart casual clothing should be worn: no boots or ripped jeans, no jackets or other clothing with offensive messages or pictures on them, no earrings or other jewellery other than watches, no clothes which are bound to be seen as disreputable or offensive. If hats are worn they must be removed on entering the school.

I reserve the right to send home any pupil or student who does not conform to these requirements. If pupils have P.E. lessons on the non-uniform day, they must bring their normal school P.E. kit with them.

At my meetings with Governors this week, I was delighted to report to them the details of the success of our students and staff in the summer exams. Following numerous requests for remarks, our overall GCSE figure is 73% A*- C including English & Maths, with a significant improvement in many subjects. May I take this

opportunity to pass on their congratulations to these students and staff for their hard work and combined effort.

Weekly Prayer


Lord God, help me to grow closer to you every day. Help me to try my best and not to give up when things go wrong. Amen

Weekly Mass - We were pleased to welcome Father Basil into school on Thursday when he celebrated our lunchtime Mass. Form 11D was in attendance and participated fully in the celebration through reading, singing (particularly well) and preparing the bidding prayers. It is encouraging to note our Chaplaincy leaders taking responsibility for the preparation of the liturgy, ably supported by their Form and Sports Leaders.

Cafod Harvest Fast Day - Mrs Ackred's assembly focused upon the CAFOD Harvest Appeal this week. Students are asked to "Brighten up this Harvest" with a non-uniform day to be held on Friday 9th October. By paying £1 each, donations this Harvest will enable Cafod partners to work with people across the world helping them to have access to tools and training, and empower them to become self-sufficient despite living in the most difficult of conditions. Additionally, our donations this Fast Day will be used to fund Cafod partners work in Europe and the Middle East to support those affected by the refugee crisis.

School Council - This week the three Key Stage Councils have taken place. Form Leaders across the school have been presenting the ideas of their peers through our revised forum for student voice. We are grateful to the 30 Form Leaders and 5 House Captains who have taken part under the leadership of the Heads of School. Each Key Stage Council will present priority items at the meeting of the full School Council next Tuesday. The full council of 16 includes representatives from each key stage council, the Head and Deputy Heads of Prefects and the Heads of School. A representative staff member of the Strategic Leadership Team will be in attendance to observe and advise only. In due course we hope to publish some of the outcomes from the work of the Council.





Inter House Debating Competition - Last Friday saw the first debate with St Andrew's proposing and St George's opposing the motion: 'This House believes the UK should welcome refugees'. A good sized floor was treated to a

strong first debate with each speaker making their case skilfully and fielding counter points from the opposing teams. Our competition convenors, Niamh Moggan and Kieran Laking-Morris kept the house in order through their efficient chairing and time keeping and there were some notable floor contributions from staff and students. The issues surrounding the welcoming of refugees were given a good airing. Congratulations to our speakers for St Andrew's; Julius Manikas, John Jenkins and Jess Lelliott and for St George's; Hanley Spence, William Blackstone Whines and Bonny Kintu. The motion was unanimously carried and St Andrew's team were judged to be the winners. This Friday's debate will take place between St David's and St Patrick's and the motion for debate is: 'This House believes that all abortion should be illegal'.

Youth St Vincent de Paul - Harvest appeal 2015 - It is around this time of year that Christians celebrate the Harvest festival. Harvest Festival reminds Christians of all the good things God has given us. As such, we try to share what we have with others who are not so fortunate. This year, St Thomas More are collecting on behalf of Southend's homeless charity, Harp. Your donations will enable Harp to provide hot meals at The Bradbury Centre and other local hostels. Harp will also provide rough sleepers with night parcels and food parcels. You can help by donating food items.
