Year 9 Mountain Walking Trip - Lake District 15th-18th June 2017 - The beautiful shores of Wastwater was the setting for this years' Year 9 Mountain Walking Trip based at Wasdale Youth Hostel, in the Western Fells of the Lake District. Day one started in Eskdale at the picturesque village of Booth. A walk up to Burnt Moor Tarn saw the best of the views. The ascent of Ill Gill and the ridge walk to Whin Rigg (height 1,755 feet) was completed in low cloud until the final descent back to Wastwater and dinner in the Hostel. The next day, as forecast, beautiful clear skies allowed a near perfect ascent of England's highest mountain Sca Fell Pike (3,209 feet) with panoramic views over to Great Gable, Pillar, Sca Fell, and the Langdale Pikes. A refreshing dip in the lake that evening cooled everybody down ready for our last days walk up the very steep, but beautiful Yewbarrow (1,686 feet) which completed a very tough but satisfying three days of walking in England's highest mountains. Mountain Walking Trip- Scotland Friday 7th to Tuesday 11th July 2017 - The long 12 hour journey up to Glen Nevis



Youth Hostel did not dampen the spirits of the students keen to experience Britain's highest mountains in the Lochaber area. The first day saw a long steep ascent onto the Grey Corries ridge. Striking for its colour, the MetaQuartzite ridge provided a fantastic view point of the surrounding mountains of Ben Nevis, the Aonachs, Mamores and as far north as the Cuillin Ridge of Sky. A long 10 hour day was rewarded by the ascent of Stob Coire An Laoigh (3,661 feet) as well as the two' tops' of Stob Coire An Easain and Caisteal. The good

weather didn't last and a very damp ascent of Ben Nevis (4,409 feet) on day two whilst enjoyable, taught the group the importance of preparation and the need for correct mountain equipment. Day three, a long drive out to Loch Quoich via Glen Garry gave the group a chance to climb a very isolated Munro-Sgurr a' Mhaoraich (3,369 feet). Fantastic views over to Loch Hourn and the Rough Bounds of Knoydart to the west and the Torridon Hills to the north. This six hour ascent in good weather completed a very gruelling three days mountain walking which the group coped with, to their credit with great determination. 
